Preparing for District Activity Day

Cabarrus County offers a variety of competitions to prepare for District Activity Day (the great day once a year where all of our 4-H'ers from across our 19 county district come together to showcase their talents). Presentations & Public Speaking are held on County Activity Day. For 2021, some of these will be in person, while others will be video submission.

Age Classes include Cloverbud (5-7), 8-10, 11-13, 14-18.

Presentations

Share your passion! Design a presentation or demonstration on your favorite things. Research on a specific topic and show what you know. Demonstrate how to do your favorite hobby. Showcase your collection. Ideas are limitless. Choose from 32 different categories, including an Open Class. Anything goes (must be school appropriate). Presentations can include technology, props, posters, and any visual aid. Limited to 6 ft. table space. Register in 4-H Online. Competition will be in person for county level and recorded for District and State.

Char-Grill

Love to grill? Want to learn more? Have a favorite recipe to show off? Char-Grill is the perfect fit! A spin on traditional presentations, youth can present their knowledge of food safety and kitchen skills through a grilling competition. Youth will have space for a pop-up tent and all of their wares needed to showcase the recipe. Choose from turkey, beef, chicken or pork for recipes. Restrictions apply. See handbook. Cabarrus County may have competition depending on sign up. District competition is in person in Rowan County on June 25.

Public Speaking

Youth may prepare 5-7 minute speeches on any topic. Speeches do not include any props, posters or visual aides.

Register in 4-H Online to secure your spot in the competition. County Activity Day will be in person by appointment May 24-27.

Art includes drawing, painting, sculpture and many different design categories including models, pottery, woodworking, edible creations and flowers. We know the selection is limited for 2020, but do you best. FOR 2020 ONLY activities from church, family and school may be used for any of the categories. Document how your used your head, heart and hands in 2020. As long as you can give good reasons, the activity will be accepted.
